Changing from conventional use of chemicals to sustainable, organic methods is essential for healthy soil and critical to the success of your native plants and vegetable gardens. You will learn about soil types, identifying soils, beneficial microorganisms, and ecology. After examining human impacts on soil, we will explore actions we can take to conserve and restore land and soils.

Our presenter is Jeff Weiss, a restoration ecologist who works at sites in Illinois, Wisconsin and Iowa. He teaches ecological restoration and horticulture at the College of Lake County and The Morton Arboretum. He founded the Buffalo Grove Environmental Action Team and the Buffalo Creek Clean Water Partnership. He is president of Living Lands Conservation Company.
