Join us to learn how shrubs can sustain pollinators by feeding their larvae and can support the birds who depend on larvae to feed their nestlings.

Our speaker is Connor Shaw, owner of Possibility Place Nursery, CFC's main source of beautiful, healthy native shrubs. He has been growing and selling native woody plants since 1978. He graduated from Utah State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in forest hydrology and a Master of Science in wild land hydrology. His Possibility Place is the area's leading showcase for native arboriculture.
